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9. Teaching and Learning Strategies

- Utilizing interactive lectures to present theoretical concepts in Qur’anic sciences, engaging students through discussions and thought–provoking questions.
- Implementing blended learning by integrating classroom instruction with online activities or content, including recorded recitations, digital lectures, virtual discussions, and electronic assessments.
- Guiding students to read and analyze primary sources from tafsir and Qur’anic sciences as part of course assignments to deepen understanding.
- Assigning student presentations on selected topics from the curriculum to develop summarization, explanation, and communication skills.
- Conducting practical workshops in thematic exegesis or linguistic analysis of selected verses, providing opportunities to practice research and applied skills.
- Promoting collaborative learning through group projects or structured interpretive discussions to enhance dialogue and teamwork abilities.
- Assigning individual or group research projects on Qur’anic topics, applying scientific methodology and academic referencing.
- Training students through analytical and writing exercises that require deriving meanings and concepts and relating them to real–life contexts.
- Facilitating discussions based on Qur’anic values.

- Reinforcing behavioral modeling by having faculty members embody Islamic values in teaching, interaction, and discussion.
- Engaging students in community service activities related to the Qur'an, such as teaching or awareness initiatives, to reinforce the practical impact of knowledge in society.
- Encouraging self-reflection through written personal reflections connecting the student's learning with their behavior or life attitudes.

10. Evaluation methods

- Written Exams (short quizzes and final exams): To assess the student's understanding of fundamental concepts in Qur'anic sciences and their ability to analyze and compare.
- Oral Exams: To evaluate the ability to articulate Qur'anic meanings eloquently, and to assess oral comprehension and interpretation.
- Research Assignments and Scientific Reports: To measure research and analytical skills, as well as the use of scholarly and Islamic sources.
- Presentations: To assess scientific communication skills, summarization abilities, and the organized delivery of Qur'anic topics.
- Class Participation and Discussions: To evaluate engagement, critical thinking, and understanding of Qur'anic values in an active learning environment.

- Individual or Group Applied Projects: To assess the student's ability to apply Qur'anic knowledge to real-life or community issues.
- Self and Peer Assessment: Used to enhance self-awareness and motivate students to improve their performance, especially in collaborative activities.
